ATTRITION

In the last seven years, 11 students, 17% of matriculated students left/failed to complete the program.

LICENSURE

Of the 56 students who graduated from the program during the period 1997-2005, 16 graduates (29%) reported that they are licensed psychologists. (This number may be higher, given that when graduates inform us that they are applying for licensure, we are not always notified as to whether or not licensure was granted). These licensure rates are consistent with the training model and mission of our program, which is to educate clinical scientists and scholars. Many of our students, although license eligible, choose to go into academic or policy positions, and delay or forego licensure.

** One student took 20.75 years to complete the program.*

*** The deadlines for application to the department were earlier in these years than in previous years, resulting in an overall reduction in the number of applications completed.*

**** Denotes fees for which a refund or exemption is available. Regarding the Health Insurance Fee, an exemption is available for students with private insurance. Students with a waiver-generating appointment will have a \$130 reduction in the amount for the insurance fee. The Psychology Department guarantees financial support for at least six years to all continuing students who are "in good standing." Students are in good standing when they are making adequate progress toward their doctoral degrees as determined by the Division in which they are enrolled.*
